Day 1: Alice Springs – Sydney



Highlights:

- Visit Hermannsburg Historical Precinct and learn how European people and local Aranda people built a thriving remote community

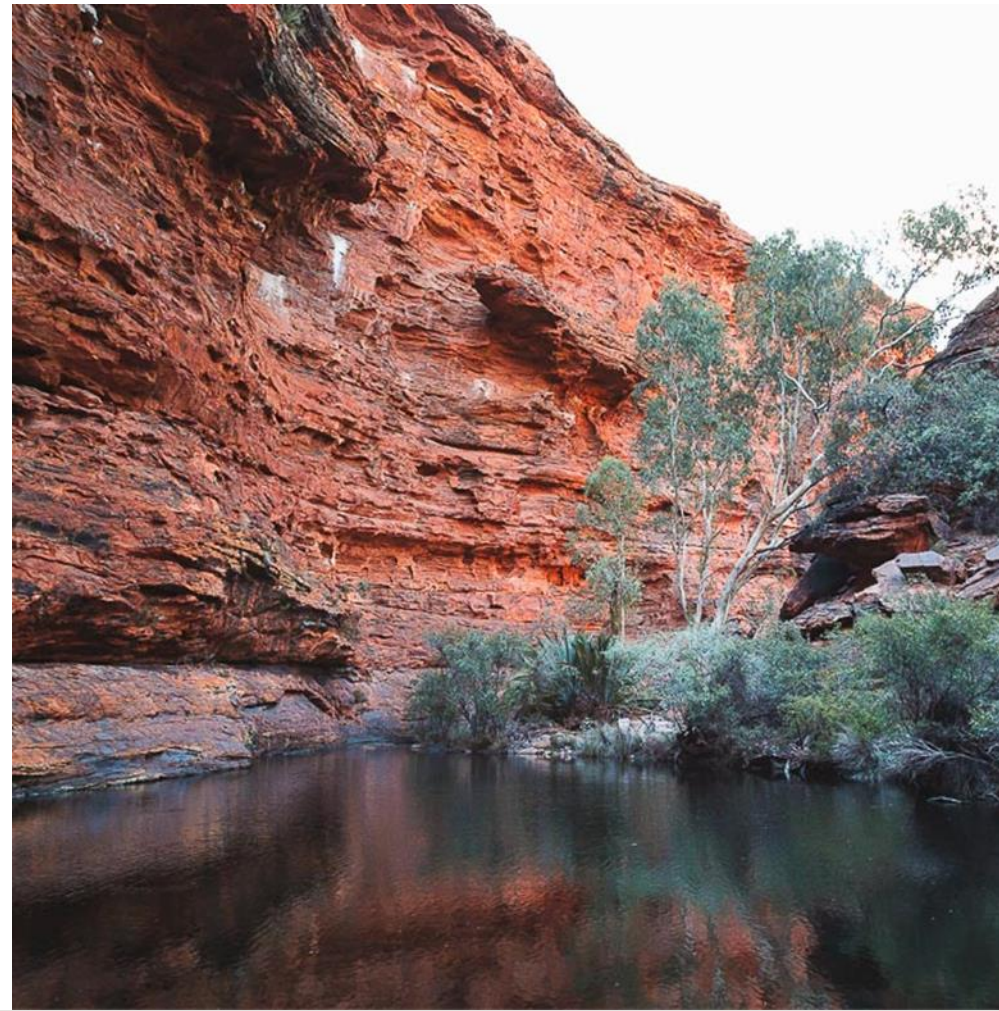


Day 4: Alice Springs - Watarrka



Highlights:

- Camels Australia – short guided camel ride. Journey in natural bushland by camel train at the foot of the James Ranges. Camel farm presentation, including felting craft
- Kings Canyon Floor Walk
- 1 night camp at Kings Creek Station



Day 5: Watarrka - Uluru



Highlights:

- The Kings Canyon rim walk
- Explore spectacular Sandstone cliffs, natural rock pools and lush vegetation at the Garden of Eden and the Lost City
- View Mt Connor often mistaken for Uluru
- Camp 2 nights at Ayers Rock Campground
- Witness the sunset over Uluru from the Sunset Strip



Day 6: Uluru & Kata Tjuta N.P



Highlights:

- Explore the 9.4 km base of Uluru and view the aboriginal rock paintings and caves
- Mutitjulu Waterhole
- Learn about the local Anangu culture at the Uluru-Kata Tjuta Cultural Centre
- Visit Kata Tjuta, the magnificent dome shaped rock formation, and hike the spectacular Valley of the Winds.
