### Welcome to our new International students:

Term 3 has started with a new addition of international students calling Marsden home for the next few years. We host approximately 80 international students from China, Korea, Vietnam and Thailand. I wish these students the very best during their time at our school and remind their carer's Ms Tina Mo is our brilliant coordinator who is the first port of call for any queries.

### A few teaching changes at Marsden Term 3:

It was a tough start to term 3 when two of our fantastic teachers made the decision to move on. Ms Megan Denton one of our dedicated English teachers has left us to move to Newcastle after two years. Mr Mark Kelly accepted a permanent offer of employment at another school. Mr Kelly worked tirelessly as PDHPE teacher as well as Year 8 Adviser. I wish both teachers all the best for their future careers. Ms Rachel Bugeja has been successful in being appointed Year 8 Adviser. We welcome Mr Brad Williams as replacement for Mr Kelly and Ms Denton's replacement starts with us in week 5. Additionally we welcome Charlotte Zhou permanently to our Mathematics faculty and Darren Varker and Murray Clare in HSIE who replace Mrs Sarah Swift and Mrs Mamey Nakhoul.

### How good are our Marsden students - the importance of Work Experience cannot be under estimated:

Work Experience plays a large role in preparing students to understand career options and choices post school. The current generation of students are expected to go through about fourteen different career choices in their lifetime and schools are required to prepare them with the creative and innovative thinking skills required for success in the C21st.

Marsden's two fantastic Career Adviser, Mrs Hart and Mrs Hooper have utilised their experience and brilliantly provided students with many options. During Week 9 Term 2 the vast majority of Year 10 students opted for Work Experience. We are proud our students really embraced the week and were absorbed in the experiences provided by employers.



### Building the future in Science – an outstanding transition to high school program:

Last week our Science faculty hosted West Ryde and Putney Primary schools in the first of three Science Club challenge days. The Year 4 and 5 students were placed into small teams and rotated through forensics challenge in their two hour sessions. A special thank you goes to Ms Mini Mathew (Head Teacher), Mrs Sudheera Nair and lab assistant Mrs Benita Muller along with our awesome Science club students who worked tirelessly throughout the day.

### Reflecting on our successes and challenges:

All Marsden students were issued their reports at the end of last term or early this term. As part of the process of distributing reports, Marsden students undertook a reflection of their progress. Students were given the opportunity to read through their reports in silence and then complete a Reflection handout which asked them to rank their progress, identify blockers to success and set goals for Semester Two. It was pleasing to see all students take up the task positively and accept responsibility for their performance at school. I encourage parents to discuss their reports with their children and especially their goals for Semester Two.

### **Getting ready for the future - New HSC changes:**

The Board of Studies has made recent changes to the HSC, which will strengthen the highly regarded credential. Under the new rules set out by the NSW Board of Studies on 19 July, the state's HSC students from 2018 will require a pass mark in numeracy and literacy in order to gain the qualification. The introduction of a Science Extension course and a common scale for Mathematics are also new changes. The HSC was last updated 17 years ago. These reforms are really about ensuring the credential prepares 21st century learners for careers and further study pathways.

The introduction of the Science Extension course will challenge and extend our best students while applying a common scale for Maths will encourage more students to study the maths course best suited to their level of ability. The new processes also include the introduction of fairer assessments to reduce student stress and anxiety, which is a key issue impacting upon the achievement of many students. Capping the number of school based assessment tasks will help reduce student stress and enable students and teachers to engage in a deeper level of learning and skill acquisition.

### **Farewell to our Junior Ties:**

Prior to my arrival at Marsden, it was decided for 2017 to have a new senior uniform, where only seniors would wear ties. With the recent influx of students in Years 7 – 10 and the subsequent lack of current style ties being available in the uniform shop and the 'loose' wearing of ties by our junior students, it was decided by our uniform committee to do away with ties for Years 7 – 10 as of August 1. Our junior students look much more presentable without ties. The expectation is that the top button will be left undone.

### **Positive Behaviour for Learning at Marsden:**

Marsden is a Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) school. Our values are Connect, Achieve, Respect and Engage, which are increasingly important to our C21st learners. PBL is a solutions focussed and positive psychology approach adopted by most schools in NSW. Sometimes schools get caught up on the problems rather than look at solutions to go forward. PBL is particularly successful when teachers role model the approach and teach the behaviour we expect. Currently the PBL team is revising our PBL structure with the intention of students being coached in regards everyday **connection** with school, **achieving** success and seeking feedback as well as expecting **respect** and demonstrating it at all times.

### **Marsden is a happy and safe school**

It is clear to me from my three months at the school that our students are happy, enjoy school and that teachers are proactive in acting to support our students. It is obvious though that sometimes things get in the way of teenagers relating perfectly with each other. It is important for students to be encouraged to report to the Deputy Principal's or myself any issues which make them feel unhappy or unsafe at school. The senior executive are the best placed staff in a school to provide support and put solutions into place. Reporting is different to 'dobbing' in that 'dobbing' is behaviour motivated by 'payback' to get someone into trouble. Reporting allows solutions to be put into place.

### **Congratulations and THANK YOU:**

**Alex Lee**, Year 8 won the Australian Under 15s Table Tennis Championships during the recent school holidays in Alice Springs. This is the second year in a row he has been Australian Under 15 Champion. Alex also finished runner up in the Under 18s division whilst in the doubles he won both the 15s and 18s titles. This month he will be competing at the Gold Coast for a chance to earn a Top 10 World ranking.

**Ethan Garrett**, Year 10, has recently been selected to play in two NSW Volleyball representative teams - the NSW u/16's All Schools team and the U/17's NSW team. Later this year Ethan will be travelling to the Gold Coast to represent New South Wales in the Australian Junior Volleyball Championships and to Minto in South West Sydney to play in the U/16's national All Schools championships. 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Life is busy in the PDHPE faculty, whether it is a sporting event, dance performance or class activity, there is a buzz of excitement and enthusiasm in the learning environment of PDHPE teachers.

Year 11 completed the mandatory Crossroads Course at the end of Term 2 through their attendance on a 3 day camp. It was a positive experience for the year group to attend the camp at Fitzroy Falls in the Kangaroo Valley. Crossroads is designed to help senior students address issues of health, safety and wellbeing at a time when they face significant changes and challenges in their lives. The aim of the 3 day camp was to prepare and support the students as they move to a stage in their lives where they will encounter situations related to identity, independence and changing



responsibilities. Through a variety of activities and workshops the students' learnt key skills around developing a sense of empowerment and respect for themselves and others. As a new teacher to Marsden I was extremely proud of the way all students took on the challenges they faced on camp and what wonderful young people and citizens we are developing here at Marsden High.



Integrated Sport is an opportunity for all students in Year 7 -10 to not only be involved in but understand the importance of regular physical activity. Moving forward this term each year group will have a four week block where they will have a choice on a variety of new activities. This will allow students to take some ownership on their choices and hopefully increase the learning opportunities and engagement in an important area of not only their schooling but their life. Marsden's two Career Adviser, Mrs Hart and Mrs Hooper have utilised their experience and brilliantly provided students with many options. During Week 9 Term 2 the vast majority of Year 10 students opted for Work Experience. One local large international company, ORIX gave five of our students the fantastic opportunity to do work experience. The students were rotated through the areas of Finance, IT, Customer Service, Operations Management and General Business gaining the experience of how each section was linked to the others.

The reviews of our students from the Executive Assistant and her staff, including General Managers of each department, were incredibly supportive of the opportunities we are delivering at Marsden. The students were equally excited and enthusiastic about their time at the company and all of the amazing learning and social experiences they had whilst there. Most telling of all was how completely different their understanding of corporate business was compared to the idea of an 'office job' prior to their work experience placement. The five students were Elijah Atienza, Vincent Chu, Jack Wu, Sean Tran and Nic Hose. Several of the students demonstrated their appreciation by buying gifts of chocolates and doughnuts to thank their supervising teams.



One student the Executive Assistance (EA) detailed to Mrs Hooper in an email of gratitude was described on Thursday as being 'painfully shy' in nature but was completely in awe of his computer skills. Due to the student's shyness, the EA wasn't sure if he was actually enjoying the experience, but she needn't have worried as she describes on his last day, the student 'brought in boxes of chocolates for the team supervising him the most and an individual thank you card each for each of us. Within each card was written things relevant to each of the team, some with direct quotes of things which had been said to him during the week. The cards were funny and heartfelt'. The EA added 'He was also able to thank me verbally on behalf of himself and the school for the opportunity given to come here. I know how

hard that would have been for him. I told him it's been like watching a flower open, day by day this week as he has become more comfortable. We all truly hope that he can continue to come out of his shell' ... 'The school should be proud of these young men. They have charmed us all and impressed us with their intellect and maturity'.

At the end of Term 2, 35 students participated at 26 different workplaces as part of the Year 10 work experience program. Places of employment included television networks, radio station, veterinarian, mechanic, preschool, primary schools, sport development and events companies, theatre, corporate business, NSW Police, plumber, office administration, pharmacy, chiropractor and retail services. The aim of our work experience program is for students to gain some experience and insight into careers they may wish to pursue to enable them to make informed choices in their subject selection for senior study.

Employers reports were extremely positive, commending the initiative, engagement and enthusiasm of Marsden High students in completing activities while in the workplace. We would like to thank all the employers for generously accepting our students into your workplaces and allowing them to gain an insight into your careers and business operations. We are very proud of their performance during the week-long program and hope the experience has provided some motivation and direction for their future career choices.



## Outdoor Recreation Course - Lithgow TAFE

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During the school holidays two Year 12 Marsden High students, Omar Abdulami and Denojan Ravi, attended an Outdoor Recreation Course run by Lithgow TAFE. Over nine days students fine-tuned their skills in abseiling and completed a three day bushwalk in the Blue Mountains. They then travelled to Kosciuszko National Park in the Snowy Mountains to participate in cross-country skiing. After completing the first outdoor recreation course in Year 11 and the return camp in Year 12, Omar and Denojan have earned credit towards their HSC. By adding a completed first aid certificate, they will receive a recognised Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation from Lithgow TAFE. Our students received glowing reports from their instructors and made some new friends from other schools.




