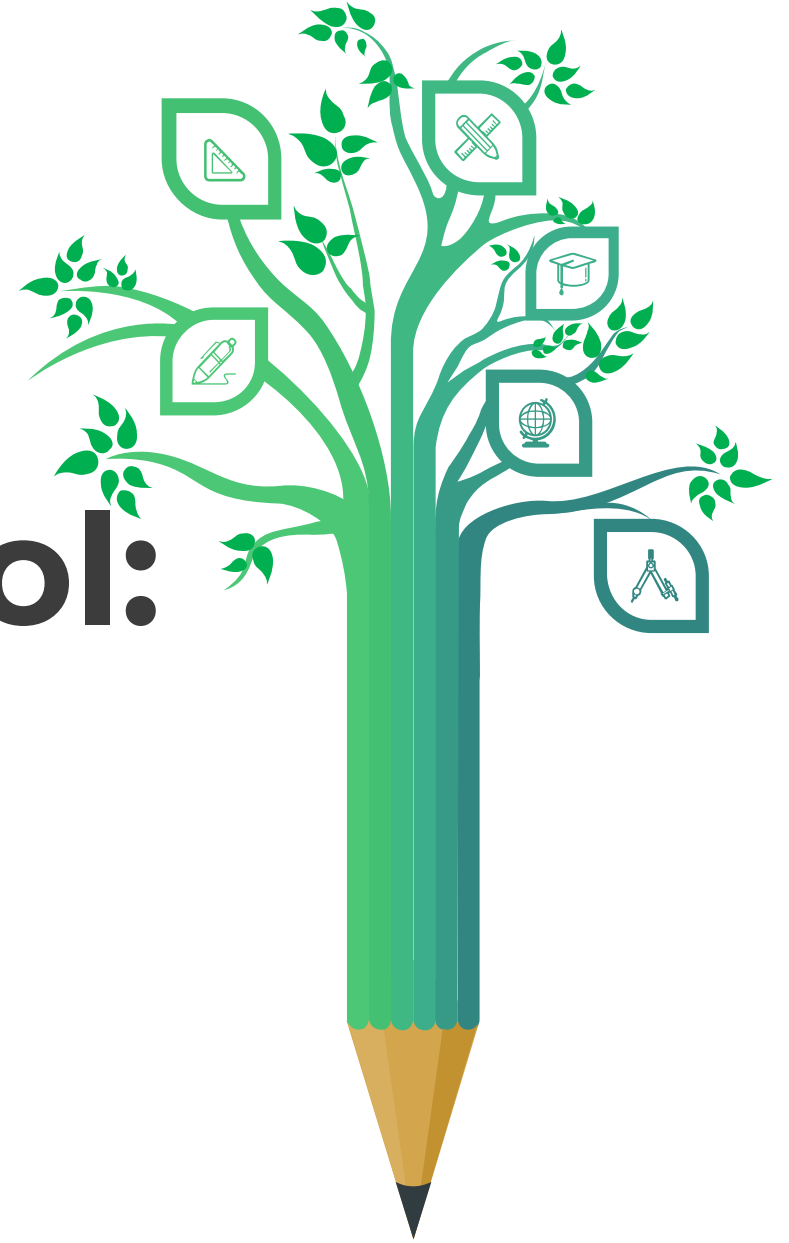




Marsden High School: Learning Structure and Information






Staged return to face-to-face teaching

The Department of Education (DoE) has been working with health authorities and the state and federal governments to plan our return to face-to-face teaching and learning. From week three (Monday, 11 May), Phase 1 of the plan is starting and year 7 to 11 students will be at school for one day a week, and year 12 students for 2. Our approach to return is being organised in line with local requirements, adequate physical space and available staff.

The DoE has outlined the following ground rules, relevant for students for the ‘managed return to school’:

- 
- Social distancing will be practised.
 - Schools are safe and will remain open.
 - Some staff will continue to work from home as they are in the higher risk categories.
 - It is expected that students will spend at least one day a week at school in Phase 1. Students who cannot learn from home will still attend each day.
 - Reporting will go ahead, but it might not involve the A – E system.
 - No more than ten students in a regular sized classroom.
 - Approximately 25% of students onsite at any time.
 - Extra cleaning will occur throughout the day as indicated by additional breaks built into the daily schedule.
 - Extra cleaning supplies have been provided to schools.
 - School buses will still operate.



Marsden High School's focus during Phase 1 of 'managed return to school':

The single unit of work is online. Students at school will be supervised by rostered staff to complete the same work that they are doing on their four "at home" learning days.

Additional teaching staff will be employed to ensure adequate social distancing is in place.

The school canteen will operate on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from Week 3.

A Family Hub will operate each day to accommodate children of frontline workers and siblings.

Social distancing will be the highest priority, and an emphasis of collective responsibility of all to observe it within the buildings and in the playground.

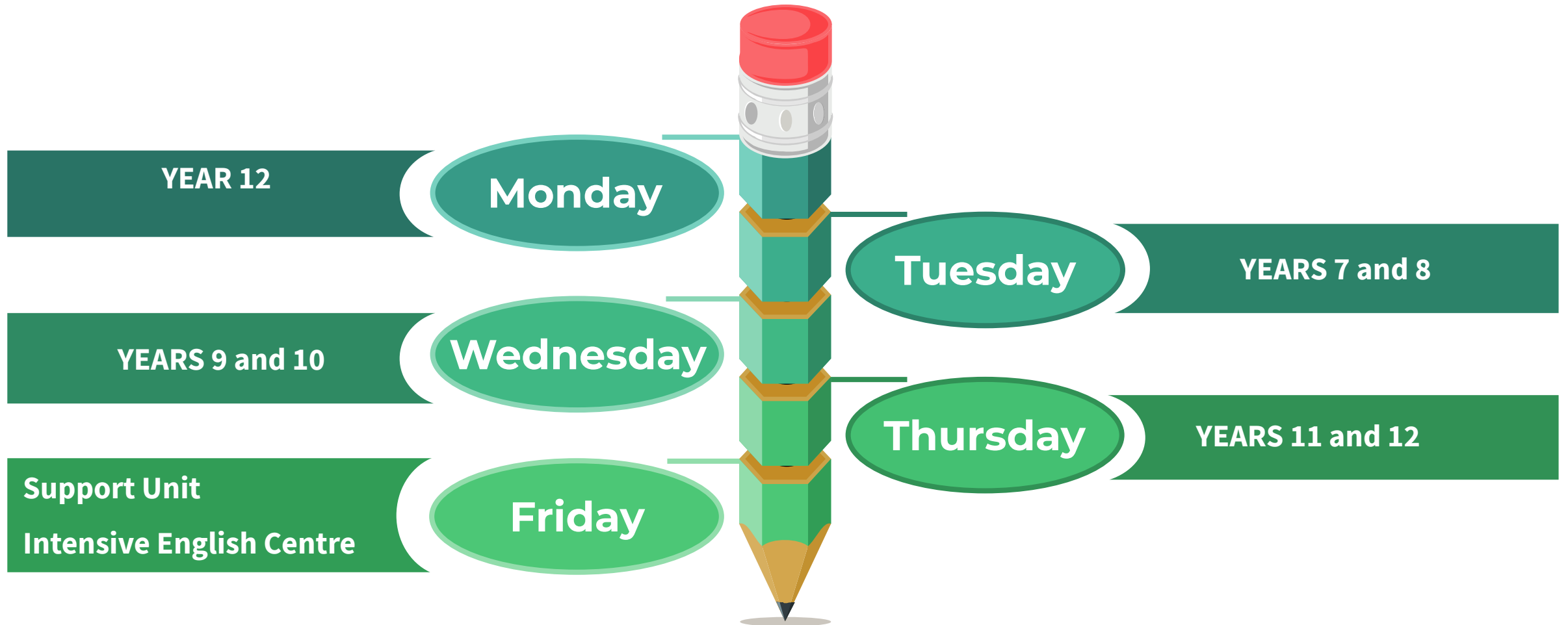
Sport, ball games, extra-curricular activities, excursions, performance evenings etc will not operate.

Students will be placed in groups allocated to different areas of the school. This includes the playground at break times.

The Family Hub: Week 3 Organisation

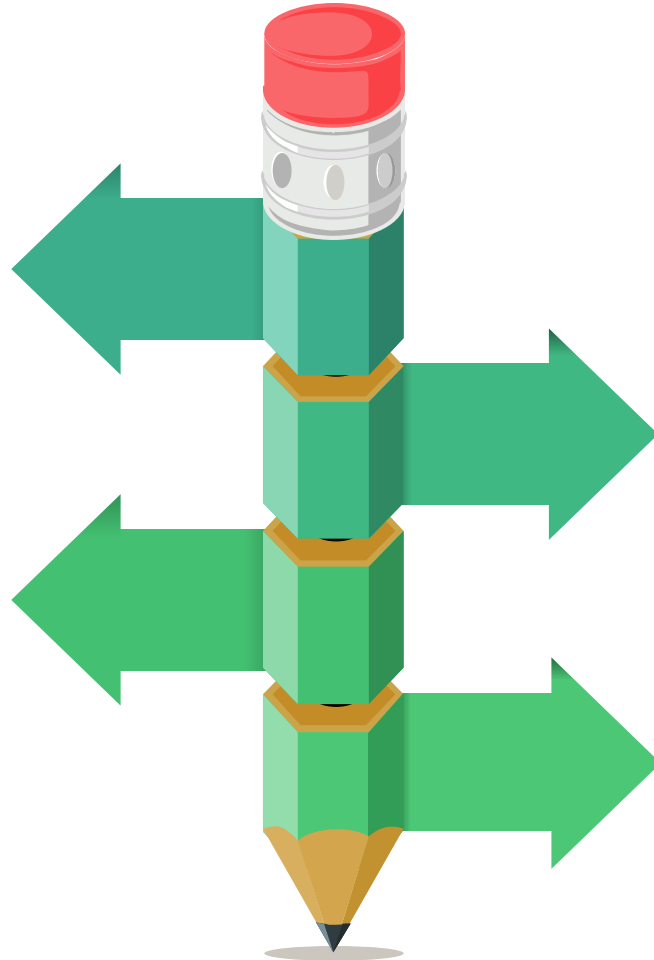
Operating times

The hub can be attended by students who are children of essential workers or are coming on a non-allocated day.

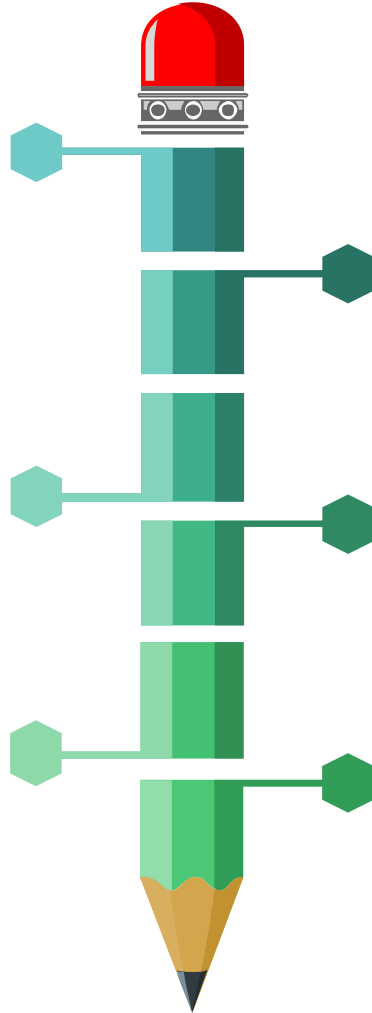
Siblings

check their google Wellbeing classroom by Thursday Week 2 for the organisation and messaging around their day at school



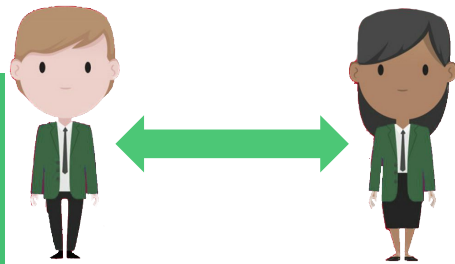
arrive at school by the time indicated on their timetable.

line up within the social distancing framework applied by the school in their roll call group

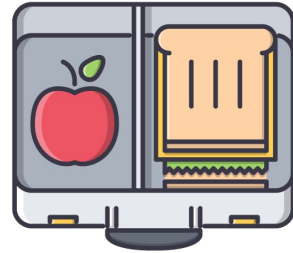


complete their exit tickets in their last session in readiness to leave for home by the time indicated on their timetable

their own headphones.



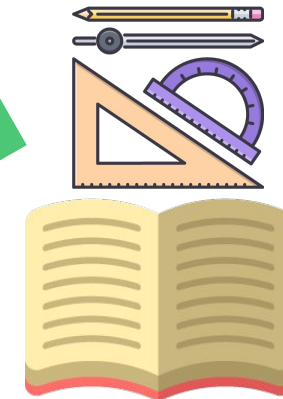
their own hand sanitiser.
