



HIGH PERFORMING AND GIFTED EDUCATION PROGRAMS 2024 APPLICATION FORM

The Pinnacle (Year 7 & 8) and Horizon (Year 9 & 10) Programs are High Performing and Gifted Education (HPGE) programs that offer extension activities to high achieving and high potential students, for the subjects of English, Science, HSIE and PDHPE. Please note that Mathematics is graded separately and is not part of the Horizon and Pinnacle programs.

Students that are interested in applying for this program, for Year 8, Year 9 or Year 10 2024, need to complete the application form and return to the Student Management office window by **Friday 8 September 2023**.

THE APPLICATION:

1. The student must complete the following application.
2. The application must include two 'sources of pride', work you have completed over the past year that showcase your ability and potential. These should be done as a 1-2 page summary of the work. Please do not attach complete, original assessment tasks or work.
3. Students are to include a portfolio supporting their application. This portfolio should include your 2023 Semester 1 report and any awards or results from competitions/tests that are relevant to your application, along with the 'source of pride' attachments. (Please do not include any original documents in your portfolio, copies only.)
4. Students are to submit their completed portfolio to Ms Marvello at the Student Management Office. The application needs to be in hard copy. Submissions via email will not be accepted.

KEY DATES:

1. Student information session on Wednesday 30 August, 8:30am - 8:50am, in N3.17.
2. Submit application by **Friday 8 September 2023**.
3. Selected students will be invited to attend an interview in Week 10, Term 3.
4. Successful applicants will be notified by Monday 16 October 2023.

SELECTION PROCESS:

Successful applicants will be chosen based on a combination of the application form, school report, additional evidence supplied with the application, participation in the interview and class performance.
